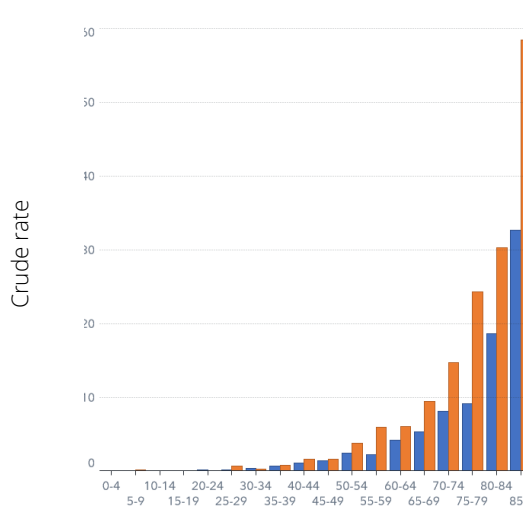

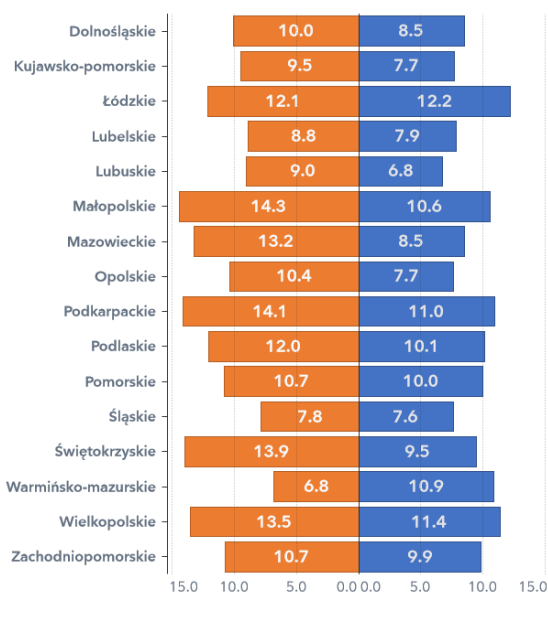
Incidence by sex



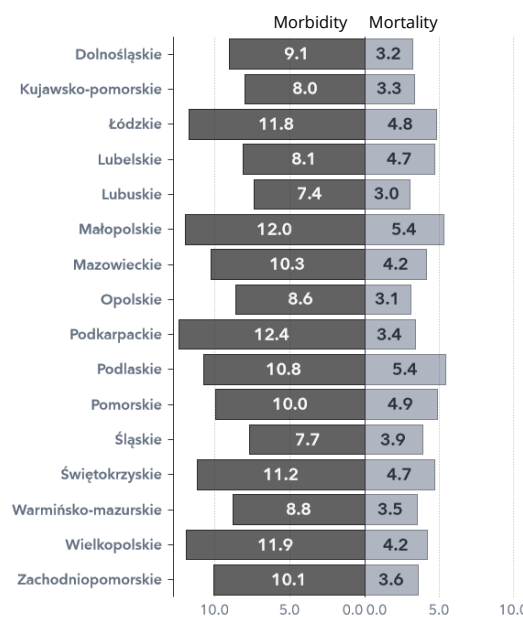
Mortality by sex
